SUBJECT: Class Deviation – Congressional Notification on Significant Contract Terminations

By the attached memorandum dated October 8, 2010, the Director of Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy (DPAP) authorized a class deviation from the requirements at DFARS 249.7001 to provide congressional notification prior to executing any contract termination involving a reduction in employment of 100 or more contractor employees for contracts with entities that are other than United States firms, which are performed in Iraq and Afghanistan. DPAP has provided a definition of “a United States firm” for purposes of the deviation.
